Scholarship requirements: To qualify for the scholarship, the applicant must:

-Be a high school senior with a 3.0 GPA or higher

-Attend Northville High School <u>OR</u> be a Northville resident attending a private school <u>OR</u> be a Northville resident that is home schooled

-Have volunteered for Friends of the Northville District Library event as a junior or senior (volunteer opportunities available – drstacer@dsemail.com)

-Submit all required application documentation by the date specified by Northville High School if your attend Northville High School <u>OR</u> submit all required application documentation to drstacer@dsemail.com if you attend a private school or are home schooled

-Be enrolled in a college/university or trade school for fall 2019

-Be available to attend NDL Friends Board meeting in May

Selection considerations:
