#### The Friend's Community Room To Be Revealed

Combining an 800 sq. ft. building expansion with a major work space renovation is more than a little bit ambitious, especially when interrupted for flood damage repair. Amazing as it is, it's all coming together beautifully. The **flood damage repair** is done, including new carpeting in the Book Cellar and woodwork repair in the Friend's Gift Shop.

The **building expansion** includes a medium size conference room, two large study rooms and secure storage for audio visual and presentation equipment. The expense is being partially offset by a state legislature grant of \$81,000 for public service improvement. The grant was championed by Jeff Noble, District Representative for the 20th district.

The conference room can easily handle groups of 18 or more. All furnishings and equipment are being provided by the **Friends of The Northville District Library**. This includes a presentation size **TV**, a large **dry erase board**, miscellaneous **audio visual** and **presentation equipment** and **furniture**. The furniture was carefully chosen to permit quick and easy changes to the room set-up.

In recognition of the **Friends**' contribution, the Board of Trustees have officially named the room the **Friends Community Room**. The room will be available for public bookings in early October. The new, large group study rooms can easily handle groups of 8-10 people, will be available in early October, and can be reserved on a "first come, first served" basis.

All three of the new rooms feature extensive windows with a nice view of the park east of the building.

The **renovation project** will greatly improve the staff work location and also include an increase from 3 to 4 small study rooms. The target completion date is late October.

The official opening will be a ribbon cutting ceremony coinciding with the **Friends' "Cider On Sunday"** event on October 21 at 2:00 PM. We encourage you to attend both events!

The annual "Just Desserts" volunteer recognition party was held on August 15 in the Carlos Room. Anne Mannisto hosted the event, stressing how much the library appreciates the incredible amount of help given by the volunteers: Library volunteers, Friends volunteers and other. She pointed out that library volunteers contribute about 700 hours of work per year, and the Friends contribute even more. The Used Book Operation contributes over 70 hours/week, and that doesn't include all of the hours in the store, in program support and the other things the friends do. All of us volunteers can really by proud of the help we provide.

Adding spice to the event The Community Financial Credit Union (one of the Friends Business Member) presented a \$1,000.00 grant from their Summer of Sharing program.

The grant was applied for and championed by Linda Schwelnus, long-time Friend volunteer. Her application stated that the grant would be used in the children's area and that: "We would use this grant to enhance the collection of hands-on educational puzzles, which help

improve spatial awareness, develop motor skills, and build logical thinking skills. We would add to/replace some of the educational toys, like magnetic maze manipulatives; color changing touch-boards for fine motor practice/pre-writing skills;

dressing frames with buttons, snaps, buckles that that reinforce early literacy skills and preschool

readiness."

We are also up and running with our new on-line partner. Since we're selling on consignment, there can be a delay between shipping the books and getting paid for them, but we have received larger checks each of the last three months.

We continue to try to improve the appearance and mood of the cellar - any suggestions would be appreciated.

We still have people asking when annual book sales. we are going to have Unfortunately, we no longer have the storage space needed to hold the books until the next sale. However, we are considering once / month sales from carts in the new Friends Community **Room**. Watch for signage in the Library.

Thanks to the generosity of Northville residents, we are receiving near record donations, including high quality DVDs and CDs. look for them in the cellar.
