TUSKEGEE AIRMEN

Monday, May 24 from 7:00-8:30 PM

In a Memorial Day remembrance and virtual program, join us to hear both Lt. Col. Alexander Jefferson and Lt. Col. Harry Stewart of the 332nd Fighter Group of Tuskegee Airmen - Redtails. The two American heroes will speak about their brave experiences and service during WWII.

By the time the 332nd flew its last combat mission on April 26, 1945, two weeks before the German surrender, the Tuskegee Airmen – Redtails had flown more than 15,000 individual raids over two years in combat. They had destroyed or damaged 36 German planes in the air and 237 on the ground, as well as nearly 1,000 rail cars and transport vehicles and a German destroyer.

After their brave service, the Tuskegee Airmen returned home to a country where they continued to face systematic racism and prejudice.




Summer Reading 2021

Northville District Library's 15th Annual Battle of the Books (BOTB), an exciting program for 6th, 7th and 8th graders, took place on March 10th. For the first time ever, the event was virtual. Eighteen teams of middle schoolers participated. All teams read a set of seven books and competed to answer relevant questions. They add to the fun by naming their team and dressing in costumes. The Friends of the Library once again sponsored the BOTB, donating a complete set of the seven books to each team.

INTERNATIONAL BOOK COLLECTION

The Northville District Library's Adult International Book Collection started in 2019 by Adult Services Librarian, Samantha Loree, as an important service for the growing



diversity in our community. The collection, at its inception, featured both adult fiction and non-fiction titles in four languages; Chinese, Hindi, Japanese and Spanish. Thanks to the Friends of the Library's generous contribution in 2020, four more languages were added to the collection; Korean, Tamil, Telugu and Vietnamese. The additional funds allowed this important collection to more than double in size, providing many more popular and classic titles from countries around the world. This year, French and German books will be added to the collection, for a total of ten foreign languages. In the future, Loree hopes to maintain and build the collection to continue representing Northville and Northville Township's diverse community.
