## NEWS



### FROM THE DIRECTOR

In 2022, the Northville District Library (NDL) conducted a user survey as part of its strategic planning process. One of the questions posed to community members solicited feedback to expressly determine how NDL could best improve its service. Close to 900 responses were provided! The Library has since been culling through all ideas submitted. To everyone who provided a suggestion - thank you very much! The Library appreciates your time and thoughtfulness. In this Director's column of our guarterly newsletter, I am going to spotlight five of the most frequently submitted ideas:

#### **Survey Response Idea #1:** An area for silent study.

**NDL Response:** The NDL has 6 study rooms available for silent study, located on the lower level of the building. They are available on a first-come, first-served basis and may be requested at the Reference Desk on the lower level for 2-hour periods with ID. Two of the study rooms can accommodate small groups (up to six people).

**Survey Response Idea #2:** One-on-one or small group classes to help with using technology like smartphones.

**NDL Response:** Anyone can book an appointment with the Library's TechXpert for a free 60-minute session for questions regarding tablets or smartphones as well as assistance with downloading eBooks, audiobooks, music or streaming video. Small group classes are also offered each quarter. **Survey Response Idea #3:** Can you order DVDs or books that you don't currently carry on your shelves if we express an interest in it?

**NDL Response:** Yes! If you are interested in an item that is not in NDL's collection, you can submit a request with the librarians at either of the service desks. Requests can also be submitted on the Library's website here: https://nvillelib.org/NDLloanrequests.

**Survey Response Idea #4:** Extended hours - Be open until 7 or 8 PM.

**NDL Response:** The NDL is open seven days a week for a total of 62 hours;

Mon.<sup>2</sup> - Thurs.: 10 AM - 9 PM, Fri. - Sat.: 10 AM - 5 PM, and Sun.: 1 - 5 PM during the school year. Additionally, the Library's digital collections are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week using your NDL card.

**Survey Response Idea #5:** Provide computers and puzzles for kids like the Library used to do before COVID.

**NDL Response:** The AWE computers and the toys are back! In fact, the NDL has been busy purchasing new toys for the Youth Department. Among the new items are: Magna-Tiles, blocks, a light table, and Green Cars and Trucks. New puzzles will be coming soon. The next time you and your family are at the NDL, stop by and explore all of the new additions in the Youth Department!

### STREAM MOVIES & TV FROM NDL

You can stream movies and TV shows with your Northville District Library card (NDL card)!

We offer Hoopla and Kanopy – two huge digital content libraries – to our cardholders.



Hoopla's catalog includes popular feature movies and TV series, including selections from BBC, ACORN TV, and PBS, as well as some of the Master Class courses.

Kanopy offers award-winning feature films, documentaries, acclaimed foreign films, and even some of the Great Courses.

Both services have apps for smart TVs, smart phones, and streaming media players (like Roku and Apple TV). You can also watch content online through their websites. No need to subscribe and pay a monthly fee, you can access content just by using your NDL card.

Anyone with an NDL card can borrow ten items on each platform every month, and whatever you borrow returns itself automatically. With Hoopla and Kanopy there are never holds lists because everything is available on demand, all of the time. Each service offers plenty of family- and kid-friendly content, and options to set parental controls.

## **Text And Learn Literacy Skills For Kindergarten**



Introducing: "TALK: Text and Learn", or just 'TALK' as it is more commonly referred to. It's an opt-in text messaging service that offers a variety of early literacy ideas for families. TALK helps children build pre-literacy skills, including hearing letter sounds, building hand muscles and dexterity, and recognizing letters and numbers. Activities also encourage the building of STEM and social-emotional skills.

Parents with children ages 5 and younger are encouraged to sign up for TALK! It's free to sign up but standard data and messaging rates may apply based on your mobile service plan. Registrants will receive about 8 - 10 text messages per month that suggest fun activities parents can do with their children.

These activities were developed by librarians, then reviewed by staff from Washtenaw Literacy. They are based on the *Every Child Ready To Read* program developed by the American Library Association that encourages families to read, write, sing, talk, and play together.

Recipients may also receive text notifications for local library storytimes and other free, children's events.

Once your child starts kindergarten, NDL and your child's teacher can recommend activities to build on the foundation you've established with TALK. You're also able to opt-out of TALK at any time after signing up. TALK has a helpful FAQ section on their website, located online at: textolearn.com.

TALK will not share your information with anyone and is stored on secure servers.

TALK is an optional service: by providing your phone number to sign-up, you agree to receive text messages containing developmentally appropriate activities. These activities are determined by the information you provide upon signup, such as: your child's age, language preference, and Zip Code.
