Northville District Library is delighted to present its brand new service to you, our makerspace called MakeIT!

With the change of seasons into colder weather comes the return to indoor activities so please consider spending time this winter in this newly rennovated space creating something unique and fun.

MakeIT is NDL's version of a makerspace, or maker lab. These labs provide unique opportunities for the community to come together or work solo to create and innovate. They represent the next generation of library services and have become more prevalent in libraries over the last decade. Many of NDL's neighboring libraries have makerspaces and it has been something we have wanted to offer to our community for a long time. In fact, NDL held our very first meeting back in 2019 to explore starting a makerspace. Although the pandemic put a temporary halt to those plans, the Library never gave up the idea.



Many of the Library's patrons also thought a makerspace was a good idea. When NDL engaged in strategic planning in 2021, and surveyed our community for various kinds of feedback, many of you mentioned this as a service you wished to see at NDL. We're pleased to fulfill this wish!

As you know, NDL has a beautiful building, but lacks space for many library needs. So when the Friends of the Northville District Library closed their gift shop (located near the Library entrance) this year, ceasing a wonderful service they diligently worked hard on for many years, it provided the Library a special opportunity to completely transform this space into a place to design, invent, and experiment.

Library staff and I hope you will thoroughly enjoy MakeIT and take advantage of everything it has to offer! Please take time to peruse page 3 to learn about the exciting new equipment in the lab and the hours it's open. We will also be offering training classes and various programs for anyone interested in learning how to use all of the services available.







3D Printer and Heat Presses

NDL's new makerspace, MakeIT, is now open! After several years of development – interrupted by the pandemic – we are excited to introduce this new line of service to the Northville community.

MakelT will offer a variety of maker tools and equipment to help users create, collaborate, and learn. Some equipment will be available for direct patron use while other equipment will require staff assistance.

Each quarter we will host MakeIT programs, where patrons can work together on a creative project in the makerspace. There will also occasionally be Take-and-Make kits to take a project home.

EQUIPMENT & SERVICES Of 3D PRINTING

The 3D print queue is now open. Visit the MakelT page of our website at nvillelib.org/makeit or scan the QR code located to the right to submit your 3D model to be printed.

OVINYL & PAPER CUTTING

With the Cameo vinyl cutter users can cut intricate designs and patterns from vinyl, paper, cardstock, and other media to use in a variety of craft projects.

SUBLIMATION PRINTING & HEAT PRESSES

This digital printing process uses heat and pressure to transfer permanent dye onto different materials, like mugs or tee shirts.

LASER CUTTING & ENGRAVING

A laser can be used with a variety of project materials – wood, metal, stone, glass, fabric, and more – to cut and engrave precise and elaborate designs.

As we grow the makerspace and add new equipment and services we will update the website. Keep an eye out for exciting additions throughout 2024.

Reading and discussing books that feature experiences different from our own helps us build empathy, explore new perspectives, and hones our critical reading skills.




