




FROM THE DIRECTOR

The Northville District Library's building will turn 28 years old this fall. Much has changed in the community since the Library first opened its doors. At that time, the combined population of the two Northville communities was 23,502 residents. In 2024, that number has increased to 37,877- a 38% percent growth in population which is remarkable for southeast Michigan. In the next few years, the Northville communities are expected to grow by another 4,000 residents- approximately 10%. Meanwhile the footprint of the NDL has remained the same and library services have dramatically changed. If you have ever attended a program in the Carlo Meeting Room where attendees were jam-packed in, tried to get a study room and were told there were none available, or tried to find a parking space, you know that there is a space issue at the NDL. The size of the building has not kept up with the growth of the community.

To attempt to address this issue, NDL's Board of Trustees contracted with Quinn Evans, an architectural firm with many years of experience working with libraries, to conduct a space feasibility study. The purpose of this study is to outline the options and financial costs of expanding its current facility or moving the NDL to a new location. Expanding the current building is challenging due to the fact that NDL does not own the park land located to east of the building (this is owned by the City of Northville) nor can the parking lot (owned by Northville Schools) be expanded. Building a new facility in another location would be challenging because

of the expense and the fact that there is little undeveloped land in the two Northville communities. Likewise, the NDL has a rich history of always being located in downtown Northville.

As part of the study that is being conducted, several public forums will be held where residents will have the opportunity to share their thoughts about the options for obtaining more space for the Library. The forums will take place at multiple times and locations. Please look for an announcement to come later this summer.

I would like to end this column by stressing that as of the publication of this newsletter, no decisions have made by the Board of Trustees regarding the next chapter of the Northville District Library. The Board will continue to research its options, gather public feedback and ultimately make its decision in a thoughtful, informed, open and transparent manner. In the meantime, please enjoy reading this issue of the NDL's newsletter and learn about all the exciting activities we have planned for you and your families this summer!

COVID-19 TEST KITS

NDL has been providing free COVID-19 test kits over the past two years through a program sponsored by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services called Library OTC COVID-19 Test program. To date, we have distributed 4,266 kits! Assuming an average overthe-counter cost of \$15 per kit, that means the community has saved approximately \$63,990 by participating in this program!

NDL will continue to offer free COVID-19 test kits to our community through the end of 2024; please ask for yours at the Information Desk on the main level of the Library.


