March is designated as National Reading Month in honor of the beloved children's author Dr. Seuss, whose birthday falls on March 2nd. Just writing that sentence brings back fond memories of how much fun it was (and still is!) to read a Dr. Seuss book. If you are reading this newsletter, you likely have an interest in libraries and enjoy reading for pleasure. Unfortunately, for many years now, the number of people who read in the United States has declined dramatically. The reasons for this vary, but reversing this trend is something we must all work together to achieve.

Research has shown that reading significantly enhances our quality of life. Book readers, in particular, tend to live longer, and reading every day has been proven to improve memory and reduce stress. It also provides opportunities for lifelong learning, critical thinking, increased emotional intelligence, and, of course, entertainment. Most importantly, reading connects people, and in my humble opinion, it is fun!

If you know someone who is not a regular reader, I encourage you to share the many benefits of reading with them. Reading can be a profound experience, but it should also be enjoyable. Discover their interests and explore books together. Encouragement always helps. Consider bringing them to the Northville District Library, where our knowledgeable librarians can guide them to books they may find intriguing and engaging.



NDL HAS SEVERAL READING AIDS AVAILABLE

NDL offers reading aids for the public to use, available at the Librarians' Information Desk on the main level and Reference Desk on the lower level. You're welcome to ask to use one of our options for the duration of your visit!

Digital Video Magnifiers

NDL offers two handheld digital video magnifiers which allow you to magnify text on a page or computer screen and are very easy to use. These devices were generously provided through the Community Financial Credit Union grant obtained by the Friends of the Library and donated by Town & Country Eye Care of Novi.

Additionally, the Merlin Elite Pro is a stationary video magnifier with text-to-speech capabilities, located on the lower level. It provides magnification up to 70x on a screen and can read articles or books aloud – available in many different languages – via an easy-to-use console. The Merlin Elite Pro was purchased with a donation from the Friends of the Library.

Full Page Acrylic Magnifying Sheet

This low-tech option is a good companion for reading magazines, books, and anything with smaller print. It instantly magnifies whatever you are reading based on



how close or far you hold it from the text you're reading.
