President's Report

2024 was another successful year for the Friends of the Northville District Library in fulfilling our mission to provide financial and volunteer support for the library, and to enhance the relationship between the library and the Northville community.

Our used book operation is a huge undertaking and one which the community of Northville seems to embrace! The resulting 2024 income of \$23,000 is outstanding! Selling used books is the Friends' main source of income and so we are very grateful for our many volunteers. The Friends started a new program to honor and acknowledge our volunteers by selecting a "Volunteer of the Month". A donation is made each month to the Gift Book Program by the Friends, and the selected volunteer has the opportunity to suggest a topic for books which will be added to the library's collection.

Once again, the Friends held a "Bookmark Contest" for Northville kids ages 5-12. Four winning designs were selected from among the many entries, and 300 copies of each design were printed. The winning bookmarks were then unveiled at our Cider on Sunday event in October and all the young artists attended and received a certificate. Book Cellar hours and other information is printed on the reverse side of each bookmark.











Our "Cider on Sunday" event was held on Sunday, October 20. The purpose of this annual event is to thank our supporters and to raise awareness for the Friends and the library. Parmenter's cider and donuts were served, and a craft was provided for kids, along with a scavenger hunt in the library. Raffle baskets were available with items generously donated by local businesses.







The Friends were happy to have official nametags made in the new MakeIT space in the library. Library staff member, Tyler, was more than willing to use his skills on the new equipment for this project!

Board members Linda Bolam and Betty Kaiser both retired in 2024 after many years of service to the library and the Friends. We are grateful for the dedication and thoughtful ideas that they both brought to our meetings. The Friends were saddened by the passing of board member Rick Nork in May, 2024.

Gift Book Program

Thanks to the generosity of the Northville Community, we received a total of 55 Gifts in 2024:

- 28 were given in memory of someone
- 5 were given in honor of someone
- 21 were given by the Friends in recognition of our volunteers
- 1 gift was given by the Northville Garden Club

The dollar amount received was \$2,050 and 153 Books were added to the Library's Collection.

Book and materials in the Gift Book Program are selected by library staff after receiving suggested topics from the donor, or the honoree's friends or family. The honored person is recognized with a bookplate placed in each item. The Friends handle all correspondence.

The Friends continue to advertise in the NDL display case during the month of May. A list of business members was added to the Friends section of the library website in 2024. We also list

our business members and patron members who wish to have their name imprinted on the fall tote bag. These tote bags are used for the October craft kit for kids, which the Youth Department supplies. 500 tote bags were handed out in 2024.

Summer Reading Program

Caryn Bartone, Head of Youth Services

The 2024 Summer Reading Program, *Adventure Begins at Your Library*, was a huge success with 1,297 participants of all ages. Reading was tracked either via Beanstack, our online system, or with a paper reading log.

The Friends of the Library generously provided the Youth Dept. with a \$8,000 gift and the Teen Dept. with a \$3,000 gift, which made the following programs possible:

- We gave out 1,500 Take and Make Craft Kits to the kids.
- Every Friday morning, we offered an all-ages Storytime.
- Cameron Zvara, comedy magician and entertainer, performed a show filled with mind blowing magic, comedy, juggling, music and tons of audience participation.
- Touch a Truck took place at Northville High School and we a had a recording breaking 1,117 people come out to see the vehicles.
- Sing and Dance with Momo Kajiwara: Momo presented a program of music and motion.
- Comics Drawing Workshop with Kam Komics: Professional comics artist Kamron Reynold led an interactive comic-drawing workshop.
- Book Walk: *The Nature Journal* by Savannah Allen. During the month of July, children and adults were able to enjoy reading this enjoyable book outside in the park behind the Library.
- Tween Camp-In: Participants joined us for spooky stories over the fire, s'mores, and more.
- Bluey Party: Bluey visited the Library and we celebrated all things Bluey.
- Wildlife Safari: Participants were able to meet a variety of exotic animals at this hands-on wildlife experience with Nelson, "The Animal Guy".
- Nutty Scientists: Cool Off...With Science! Participants learned the amazing things dry ice can do followed by guided activity tables.
- Adventures in Tie Dye: Participants created their own tie-dye masterpiece.
- Magic Carpet Theater: Where the Wild Things Are: A live performance of Maurice Sendak's American classic of a boy's journey into his imagination.
- Water Explorers with Sloan Museum of Discovery: Participants explored water properties as they investigated whether objects sink or float, retrieved a special underwater treasure, and built a boat that floats.
- Wizards, Wands, and Potions with Sloan Museum of Discover: Participants stepped into a world full of wizards and witches and built their own light-up wand and squished their fingers into ghost brains.
- Paleo Joe: Let the Dinosaur Adventure Begin: Paleo Joe took participants on a trip back in time to when dinosaurs ruled.
- Tween Spy Camp: Participants learned new skills and completed covert challenges.
- The Music Lady, Beverly Meyer: A fun, family-friendly concert.
- Stay and Play: Families dropped in to visit, make new friends, play with toys, and enjoy donuts and coffee.
- Toy Story Party: Buzz and Woody visited the Library while participants played games inspired by the movies and completed a craft.
- Teen Annual Shelter Pet Art Contest: Teens created amazing art to help promote awareness of local adoptable pets.
- Teen Custom Water Bottles: Teens personalized water bottles by using vinyl images from our MakelT space, stickers, and paint.
- And Then There were None, Teen Murder Mystery Party: Participants solved a bookish murder mystery.

- Teen High Boba Tea: Participants enjoyed high tea with boba and other delicious treats.
- Teen Light Up the Nerf Night: A glow-in-the-dark NERF war.
- Teen Game On in the Library: Tabletop games, video games, and a D & D adventure.
- Teen Adulting Escape Room: Teens made their way through an obstacle of emails, sorting laundry, and packing lunch to escape.
- Ten Backpack Makeovers: Teens brought in their backpacks for a makeover with patches, buttons, keychains, decals, and more.

Youth Program Participation

June: 10 programs with 1,398 attendees July: 17 programs with 767 attendees

August: 8 programs with 525 attendees (The program ended on August 3.)

Teen Program Participation

June: 5 programs with 139 attendees July: 3 programs with 38 attendees August: 2 programs with 11 attendees

The funding also provided prizes for the Youth and Teen Departments. The kids who completed the program received a free book, a token for our prize-filled gumball machine, and an entry into the Youth Grand Prizes. We offered six Youth Grand Prizes.

The Teen Dept. was able to provide prizes for all of the finishers, which included a coupon to the Friends Book Cellar, along with a random drawing of various gift cards for the finishers.

We were able to celebrate the end of Summer Reading with a Summer Reading Finale party that over 237 people attended. Kona Ice provided cool treats for everyone, there were inflatables for the kids and teens, lawn games, airbrush tattoos, balloon creations, and bubble entertainment with The Motley Misfits.
