





- Items from other libraries will be available through in person pick up at the lending library.


Friday, July 18:


NDL closes at 5 PM to begin the switch to the new catalog.

Do I need a new library card?

No, your current card and PIN will still work. You can change your PIN in your account anytime, too. Your Preferences Contact Information Messaging Settings Linked Accounts Reset PIN/Password Libby Options Hoopla Options

Can I still borrow from other libraries?

Yes! Just take your NDL card and ID to each neighboring library you visit, including Novi Public Library. You may need to annually renew your card at each library.

Can I still place holds at other libraries?

Some neighboring libraries allow it if you register your card with them. Please note: NDL can't be selected as a pickup location for those holds.

What if NDL doesn't have what I need?

You can borrow from libraries through MeLCat, Michigan's statewide interlibrary loan system. Ask a librarian - we are happy to help.

What is MeLCat? MeLCat lets you borrow from libraries across



Michigan, including college,

regional, and public libraries. It's a great way to access even more titles than we can store here at NDL. Visit **MeL.org** to begin.

NDL has book club kits that hold 8 copies of a book, with a packet of questions and the author's bio that you can check out for up to 3 weeks at a time.

When holding your own book club, we recommend asking open-ended questions, which are questions that allow the person answering to do so in their own words and do not limit people to "ves" or "no."

We've compiled a short list of recommended open-ended auestions for you here:


- What did you think of the author's writing style?
