# **SUMMER READING 2025**

Hot, Hot, Hot! What did NDL patrons do during this blisteringly hot summer? They read of course!

The Library's Summer Reading Program was a huge success. Readers were asked to track minutes read instead of how many books read. After all, some books are really long! I'm thinking "Moby Dick".

We had 1,374 participants overall, with 1,108 of them completing the program! Combined, Northville read a total of 1,164,453 minutes from June to August when summer reading ended. In hours, that's 19,407; or 808 days! The program saw a 6% increase in registrations from 2024. And the kids outshone every other group with 839 readers.

The Summer Reading finale party was held on August 6th in the park behind the NDL and it was a smashing success. It was attended by 312 people, a 32 % increase from 2024.

In addition to treats from Kona Ice, an inflatable bounce house, an inflatable obstacle course, and art stations provided by the Ann Arbor Hands-On Museum there was a new event at this year's party--a partnership with the City of Northville Fire Department. The firefighters and even some library staff took a turn in a dunk tank and raised \$527.00 for the Living and Learning Center.

In the words of Laura Mancini, the Library's director, "The Summer Reading program would not be possible without the financial support of the Friends of the NDL. In 2025, they provided \$14,000 for the program, an increase of 17% percent from last year."

This partnership of the library and the Friends, is an example of the generosity of our members doing good. We are a community of readers and, obviously, lovers of the library.




This dancing skeleton tote bag can be picked up at the information desk during the month of October.

White House Chef Mysteries a series of 9 books by Julie Hyzy recommended by Regina Mingela




